4. First-aid measures

Description of necessary first-aid measures

Inhalation: If mist or spray is inhaled and symptoms occur, move to fresh air. Get medical advice if symptoms persist.

Skin Contact:	Wash with soap and water. Discontinue use if irritation develops.
Eye Contact:	Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists, get medical advice/attention.
Ingestion:	Rinse mouth. Do not induce vomiting unless directed by medical personnel. Get medical advice if unwell.
Most important symptoms/effects:	Direct eye contact may cause redness, tearing, burning and discomfort. Mist or spray may cause temporary respiratory irritation. Ingestion may cause gastrointestinal discomfort.
Immediate medical attention and special treatment:	Treat symptomatically. No specific antidote is known.

5. Fire-fighting measures
