4. First-aid measures

Inhalation:	Move the person to fresh air. If coughing, headache, dizziness or breathing discomfort develops or persists, obtain medical attention.
Skin contact:	Remove contaminated clothing. Wash affected skin with plenty of water and mild soap. If irritation develops or persists, obtain medical attention.
Eye contact:	Immediately rinse cautiously with water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Obtain medical attention if irritation persists.
Ingestion:	Rinse mouth. Do not induce vomiting unless directed by medical personnel. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Contact a poison center or physician if unwell.
Most important symptoms/effects:	Direct eye contact may cause temporary redness, tearing or stinging. Prolonged skin contact may cause temporary irritation. Excessive vapor exposure or airborne mist generated during manufacturing may cause temporary headache, dizziness or respiratory discomfort.
Immediate medical attention / special treatment:	Treat symptomatically. No specific antidote is known.

5. Fire-fighting measures

Suitable extinguishing media:	Use water spray, dry chemical, carbon dioxide, or foam suitable for the surrounding fire.
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Unsuitable extinguishing media:	No specific restriction identified. Avoid a high-pressure water stream if it may spread spilled material.
Specific hazards:	Combustible liquid. Vapors may accumulate when the product is heated or handled in poorly ventilated areas. Containers exposed to heat may rupture. Thermal decomposition or incomplete combustion may produce carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, silicon oxides, formaldehyde and irritating fumes.
Special protective equipment:	Firefighters should wear full protective clothing and positive-pressure self-contained breathing apparatus when exposed to smoke or decomposition products.

6. Accidental release measures

Personal Precautions:	Remove flames, hot surfaces and other ignition sources. Ventilate the area. Avoid breathing concentrated vapor or mist. Wear appropriate gloves and eye protection.
Accidental Release Measures:	Product creates an extreme slip hazard. For small spills, wipe up with cloths or absorbent material. For larger spills, contain with sand, vermiculite or another inert absorbent. Collect in a compatible container. Clean residual silicone film with detergent after the bulk material has been removed. Do not use water alone, as it may spread the slippery film.

7. Handling and storage

Handling:	Keep away from flames, hot surfaces and ignition sources. No smoking. Avoid eye contact and prolonged skin contact. Avoid breathing concentrated vapor or mist. Use adequate ventilation during bulk mixing, transfer and filling. Control static electricity during bulk transfer where appropriate. Keep containers closed when not in use. Wash hands after handling.
Storage:	Store tightly closed in a cool, dry and well-ventilated location. Protect from excessive heat and direct sunlight. Keep away from strong oxidizing materials.

8. Exposure controls / personal protection

Control Parameters / Occupational Exposure Limits:

No occupational exposure limits have been established for the finished mixture.

Engineering Controls:	General ventilation is normally adequate during routine closed-system handling and filling. Use local exhaust ventilation for open mixing, heated processing, bulk transfer or operations that may create vapor or mist.
Eye / Face Protection:	Wear safety glasses or chemical splash goggles where splashing may occur.
Skin Protection:	Wear suitable chemical-resistant gloves during bulk handling or cleanup. Avoid prolonged or repeated skin contact. Wash hands thoroughly after handling.
Respiratory Protection:	Respiratory protection is not normally required when the product is handled as a non-spray serum with adequate ventilation. If significant vapor or mist is generated, or ventilation is inadequate, respiratory protection should be selected based on a workplace exposure assessment and used under an applicable respiratory-protection program.
